

The social sector often treats problems as simple or complicated

Traditional Approaches Are Not Solving Our Toughest—Often Complex—Challenges


- Funders select individual grantees
- Organizations work separately and compete
- Evaluation attempts to isolate a particular organization's impact
- Large scale change is assumed to depend on scaling organizations
- Corporate and government sectors are often disconnected from foundations and nonprofits

Isolated Impact



Imagine a Different Approach—Multiple Players Working Together to Solve Complex Issues

- All working toward the same goal and measuring the same things
- Cross-sector alignment with government, nonprofit, philanthropic, and corporate sectors as partners
- Organizations actively coordinating their action and sharing lessons learned



Collective Impact recognizes that no single organization is responsible for a major social problem, so no single organization can cure it

Collective Impact is the <u>commitment</u> of a group of important actors from <u>different</u> sectors to a <u>common agenda</u> for solving a <u>specific social problem</u>.

Collective Impact Involves Five Key Elements

Common Agenda

- Common understanding of the problem
- Shared vision for change

Continuous Communication

- Consistent and open communication
- Focus on building trust

Mutually Reinforcing Activities

- Differentiated approaches
- Willingness to adapt individual activities
- Coordination through joint plan of action

Shared Measurement

- Collecting data and measuring results
- Focus on performance management
- Shared accountability

Backbone Support

- Separate organization(s) with staff
- Resources and skills to convene and coordinate participating organizations
